ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

For admission to programmes of study at **MIDLANDS STATE UNIVERSITY** for the **DIPLOMA IN EDUCATION (secondary) programme**, a candidate must have the following qualifications in the **ZIMSEC School examination or equivalent**:

Other than the required passes in relevant subjects at ZIMSEC ‘O’ Level or equivalent, for the Humanities, Commercials and Practicals categories, candidates are expected to select two subjects from the category of their choice. From the Sciences category, students are expected to choose either Mathematics OR Science. For Accounting, Economics and Science a student should have passed Mathematics at grade C or better. A pass in Literature in English is required for English.

DURATION OF STUDY

Duration of study for the Conventional and Parallel programmes includes one year of **WORK RELATED LEARNING**. **NB*** Candidates should note that they will not be considered for study programmes at MSU if they have accepted or registered to study at any other tertiary institutions.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE COMPETENCY (For applicants from a non-English speaking background).
